BC NDP secures mandate to keep making progress for working families: BCFED

With the re-election of David Eby and the BC NDP, BC's labour movement is looking forward to building on their momentum to make big improvements in the lives of working people over the next four years.

"British Columbia voters have given David Eby and the BC NDP a renewed mandate for solid, progressive change," BC Federation of Labour (BCFED) President Sussanne Skidmore said.

"His campaign set out a clear plan to invest in the services we count on, bring costs down and make life for working people better — at home, in the workplace and in our communities."

"We're looking forward to continuing to work with David Eby and the NDP caucus on the issues that matter to workers," said Secretary-Treasurer Hermender Singh Kailley.
