Fight for \$15 Minimum Wage Campaign Launches New BC Election Video

Vancouver – With the provincial election just seven months away, the BC Federation of Labour is releasing a new 30-second video today urging voters to elect a government that will implement a \$15 per hour minimum wage for all workers.

The video highlights the financial challenges faced by minimum wage workers who earn less than \$20,000 per year and identifies a simple solution: raise BC's minimum wage to \$15 per hour.

Nearly half a million British Columbians—one out of four workers in the province—earn less than \$15 per hour. The majority are women and 81% are 20 or older.

“Our Fightfor15BC.ca campaign will improve living standards for hundreds of thousands of workers and their families,” says BCFED President Irene Lanzinger. “It’s a key element in a concrete poverty reduction strategy to address the widening gap between rich and poor in BC.”

While BC has the highest cost of living in the country, the province’s current \$10.85 minimum wage is at the bottom of the table in Canada and leaves workers more than \$5,000 below the poverty line.
